What you need to know about pressure washersNot you can just rip any pressure washer off the shelf: These machines (particularly gas pressure washers) are incredibly strong. It's what makes them so effective, but it also means there's an increased risk of injury and surface damage if you don't know what you're doing. You really have to respect the power of these machines, says DiClerico. Here's what to keep in mind: Electricity vs. gas: When buying, this is the first and most important decision to make, says DiClerico. All pressure washers work the same way: an engine feeds water through a concentrated nozzle, he explains. Where things differ is how that engine is powered: by electricity or by gasoline. An electric machine is generally suitable for the vast majority of homeowners and can address projects such as car wash, lawn furniture cleaning and point-in-time treatment surfaces, Says DiClerico. They are more affordable (think \$300 and below), lighter, quieter and easier to store and maintain. Gas machines, on the other hand, are more used by professionals, because they are much more powerful, says DiClerico. They will fly almost any dirt and debris, use them for things like decks and sidewalks, but they are much more expensive (think \$300 and more), plus they are bigger, heavier, louder and harder to maintain. PSI: PSI, or pounds per square inch, indicates the water pressure delivered by the machine, says Adrienne Hunt, Home Depot's associate merchant. Pressure washers with a high PSI deep stains more effectively than machines with a lower PSI. Electric pressure washers typically range from 1,600 PSI to 2,300 PSIGas pressure washers, ranging from 2,700 PSI to 4,400 PSI. GPM: Although PSI is important, you can't just trust it. PSI and GPM, or gallons per minute, in tandem are very important, says Rachel Rothman, Rothman, and director of engineering at the Good Housekeeping Institute. One without the other won't result in the right combo. GPM measures the volume of water supplied by the pressure washer, an indicator of how quickly the machine will be cleaned. Higher GPM pressure washers will clean faster than those with a lower GPM, Hunt says. Safety: When using pressure washers, particularly more powerful gas models, it can easily cause bodily and surface damage, such as chips, if you're not careful, Rothman says. Wear closed shoes and safety goggles at all times when operating your pressure washer. And if your machine comes with interchangeable nozzles, use the least powerful one first (you can always progress to a stronger nozzle if necessary) and position yourself about four feet from what you're cleaning. If in doubt, try a discrete area first. Key ConsiderationsThe cleaning energyThe rest, your main consideration when buying a washing machine pressure is their cleanliness ability. This capacity is measured in cleaning units (CU). A simple equation for determining the cleaning efficiency of a pressure washer is the cleaning of equal units per square inch per gallon per minute: CU a psi x gpm. Simply put, pounds per square inch measures the intensity of water pressure, and gallons per minute measures output flow. This means a medium-service pressure washer with 2,900 2,900 per square inch and 2.4 gallons per minute has 6,960 cleaning units. More cleaning units are better, of course, because a more powerful pressure washer can clean faster and more thoroughly than a less powerful one. Keep in mind, however, that larger engines weigh heavier, making a larger tool more difficult to maneuver. The Generac website offers a useful guide that breaks down the pounds per square inch ideal for various tasks, ranging from cleaning cars and boats to beautification of cement and bricks. There's even a level for industrial uses, so if you're having trouble measuring how powerful a pressure washer you need, check there first. Nozzle tipsThe size of the pressure washer motor and cleaning units take into account how effective it is in your work. That said, you can still adapt the machine to do whatever you want with multiple nozzle tips for different widths in the spray pattern. The most common nozzles are below: 0o red nozzle: This nozzle fires a concentrated stream of water directly out of the wand. The most powerful red nozzles available should be used with care. 15o Yellow Nozzle: Yellow is slightly less powerful than red, but is still made for heavy duty cleaning. Use it to remove paint or remove dirt from hard surfaces. 25o Green Nozzle: A very common, green mouthpiece offers a healthy dose of indirect potency. Ideal for entrances, decks and some vehicles. 40o White Nozzle: This is a soft, low-pressure spray for more delicate surfaces such as windows. White nozzles can also be used to wash cars, but be careful not to get too close to painted surfaces. 65o Black Nozzle: You can use this very low pressure nozzle to apply soap, detergent and other cleaning agents. This includes ear protection for stronger units and eye protection to protect against lifting waste. Stand on a stable surface when using a pressure washer. Never stand on a ladder, table or stool because the pressure of the washing machine could unbalance you. Start about 18 inches away from your low-pressure lens. Presoak the surface, let the detergent or degreaser sit before passing over it again. Decrease the distance and increase the pressure as needed, but stay beyond 6 inches away to avoid damage. Move in an overlapping move from side to side at a 45o angle. Do not use hot water in a cold water pressure washer. Many professional grade pressure washers use hot water to clean more efficiently, but using hot water in a cold water unit can damage the pump or other components. Currently, Generac does not offer any models that use hot water. FAQQ Can I wash my car with a pressure washer? To. Pressure washers are powerful machines, but it's completely safe to use one to wash your car if you do it properly. First, start with running water and use a low-pressure nozzle as a white tip, then resist the desire to get too close to the paint or windows of your vehicle. Use this time to remove loose debris and dirt. Then switch to a soap nozzle as a black tip. Apply the chosen detergent and work from the bottom up on wide, overlapping strokes. However, we recommend using an exfoliating brush for difficult points and greater clarity. Finally, return to the white tip and rinse from top to bottom. Dry, then apply wax or enamel as you see fit. Q. What shouldn't I wash with my pressure To. Pressure washing is extremely effective, but it is not the best method for each surface. For example, drywall and fabric take a long time to dry and can develop mold and fungi even after thorough pressure washing. In addition, pressure washing is not always recommended for wood coatings. While it can be made, water that gets under the lining can soak in the wood and encourage mold growth. Worse, it could damage the insulation or wiring inside the wall. Other areas to prevent pressure washing include anything with complex or exposed electronics, such as electrical panels, meters, circuit breakers, and air conditioning units. While these are designed to handle natural precipitation, high-pressure aerosols can overwhelm seals and cause damage. Q. My mouthpiece is clogged. Why is this happening and how can I fix it? A. If you notice poor pressure outside your electrical washer, or if the spray is erratic, you may have a clogged nozzle. This happens when debris passes through the system and get stuck in the nozzle, or when buildup or corrosion occurs. If yours is clogged, it requires your attention immediately. An ignored blockage can decrease pressure flow, which can damage the pump. Most clogs can be removed with the manufacturer-provided nozzle cleaning cable. If you don't have one, a paper clip unfolded will do. What are the benefits of an electric pressure washer? A. Generac does not currently offer electric pressure washers, investing in innovative internal motor designs and features. However, that doesn't mean that electric models don't have advantages. They are often cheaper than gas units, on the one hand, and are significantly simpler, starting with pulling a switch and requiring very little maintenance. On the downside, electric pressure washers are less mobile than gas equivalents due to the power cord, and usually also have less power. However, for light to medium jobs, one is an excellent choice.
